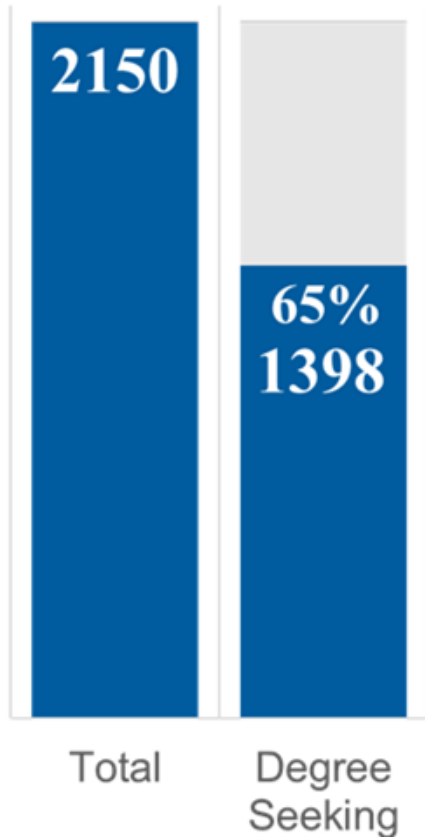

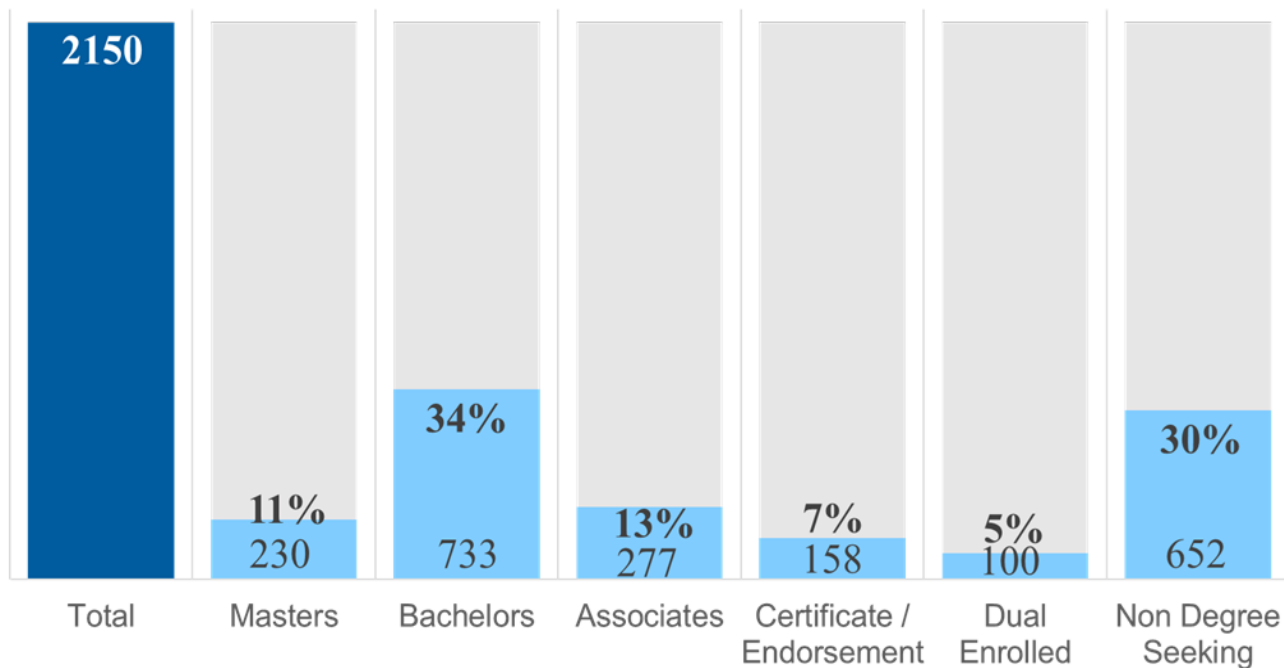
Fall 2019: UAS Students by the Numbers



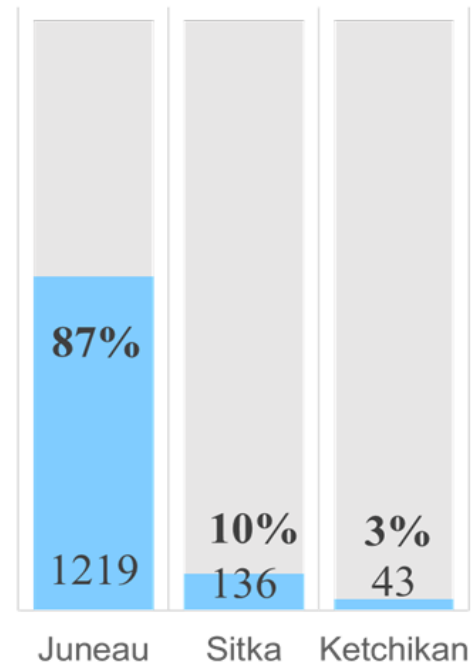
- 2,150 students enrolled for credit

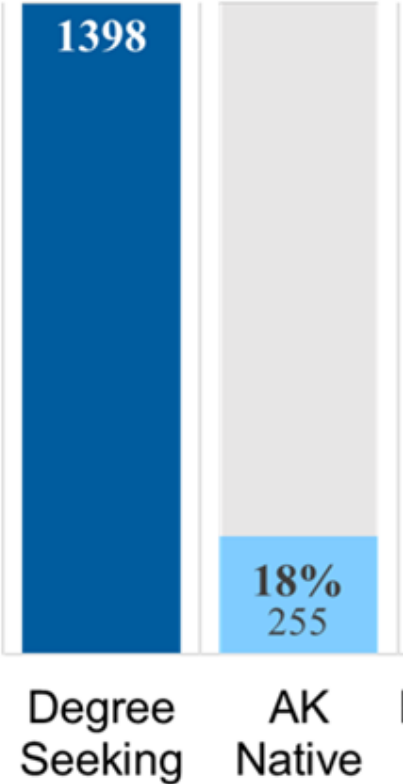
Primary Declared Degree

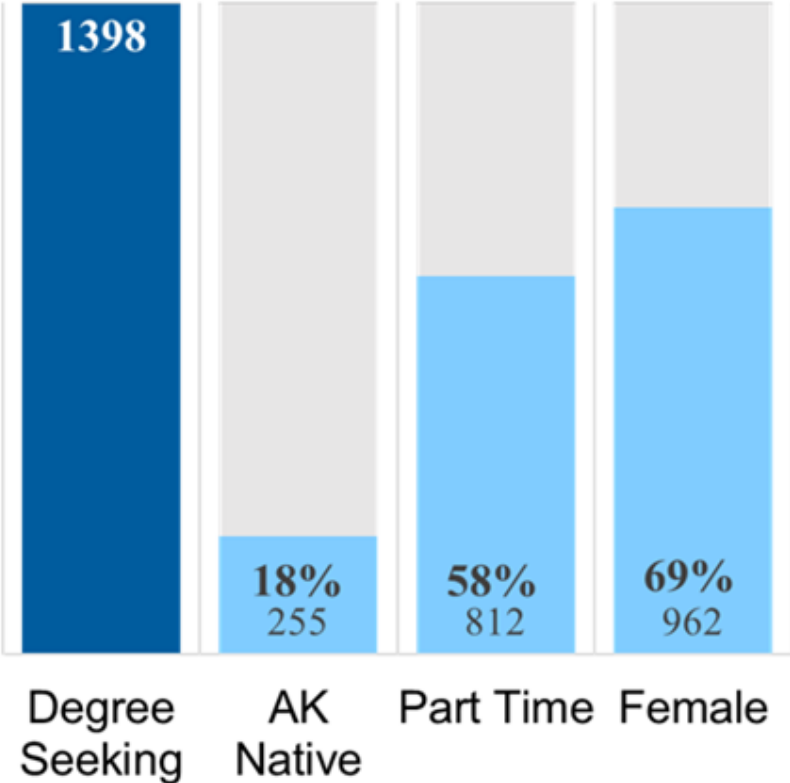

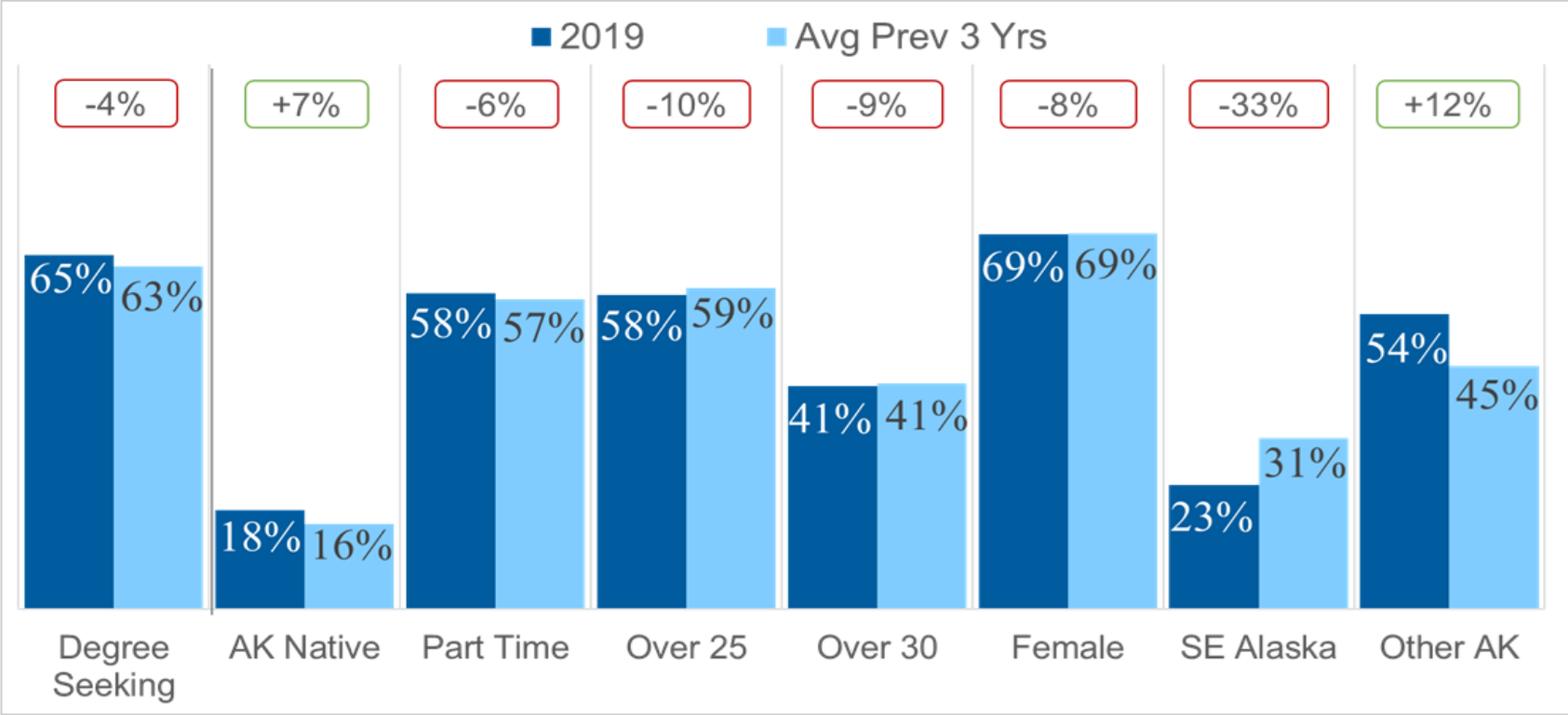

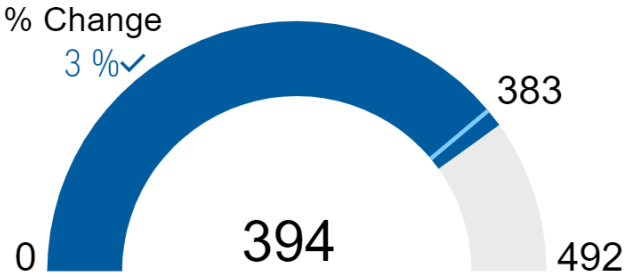
UAS Degree Seeking Students Over Time



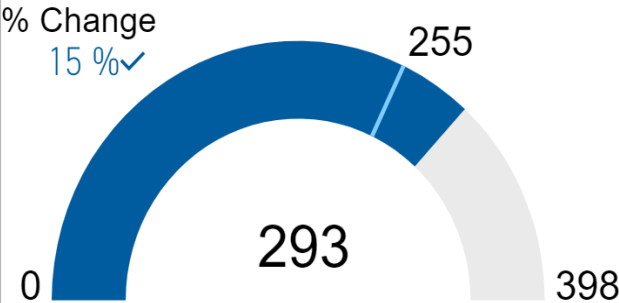
*Boxes at the top represent the percent change in headcount from the average of the previous three years (Fall 2016, Fall 2017, Fall 2018) to Fall 2019.

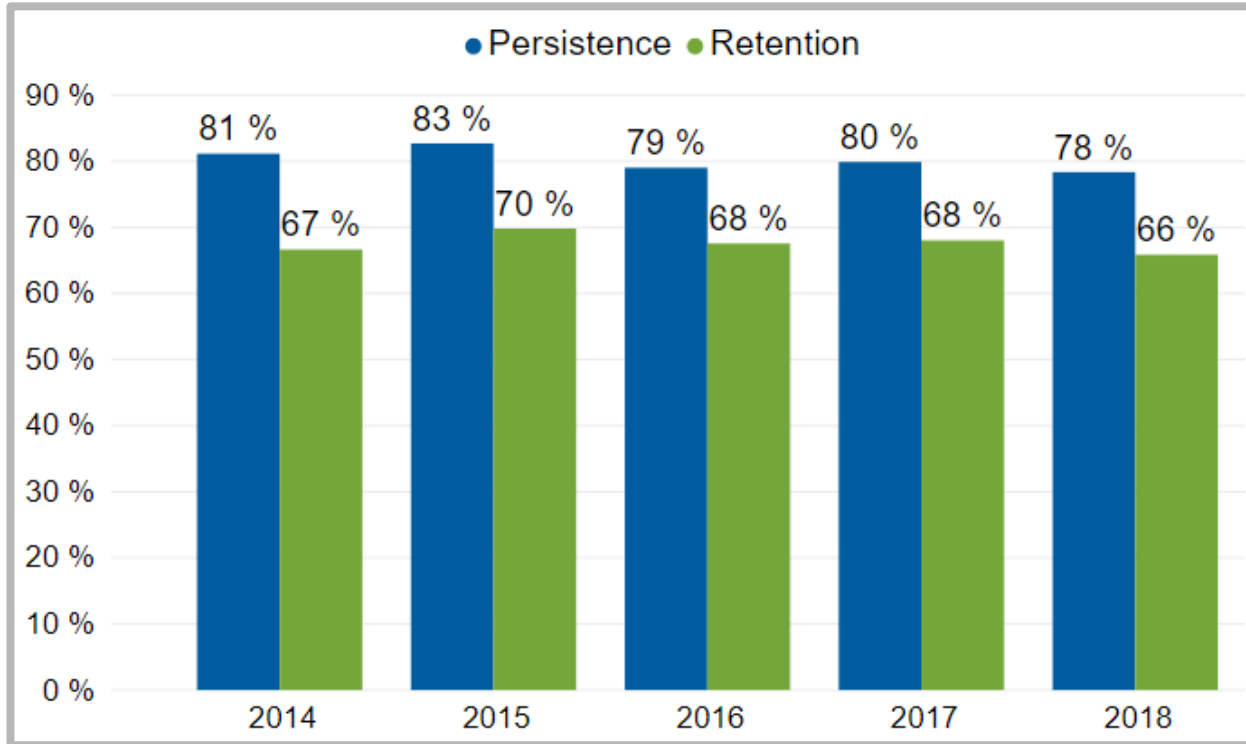

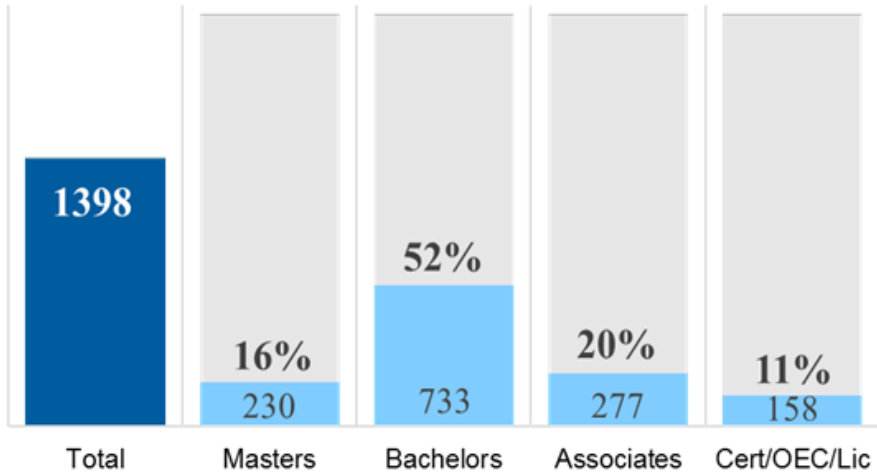

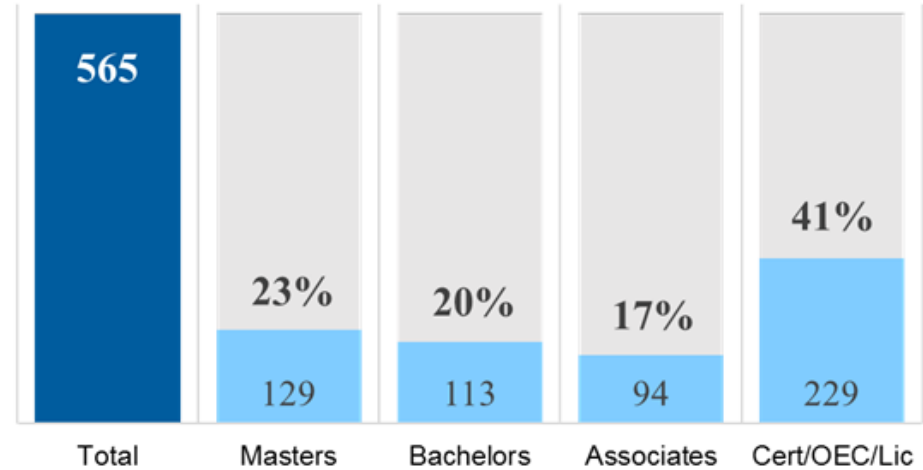


Declared Degree compared to awarded degree

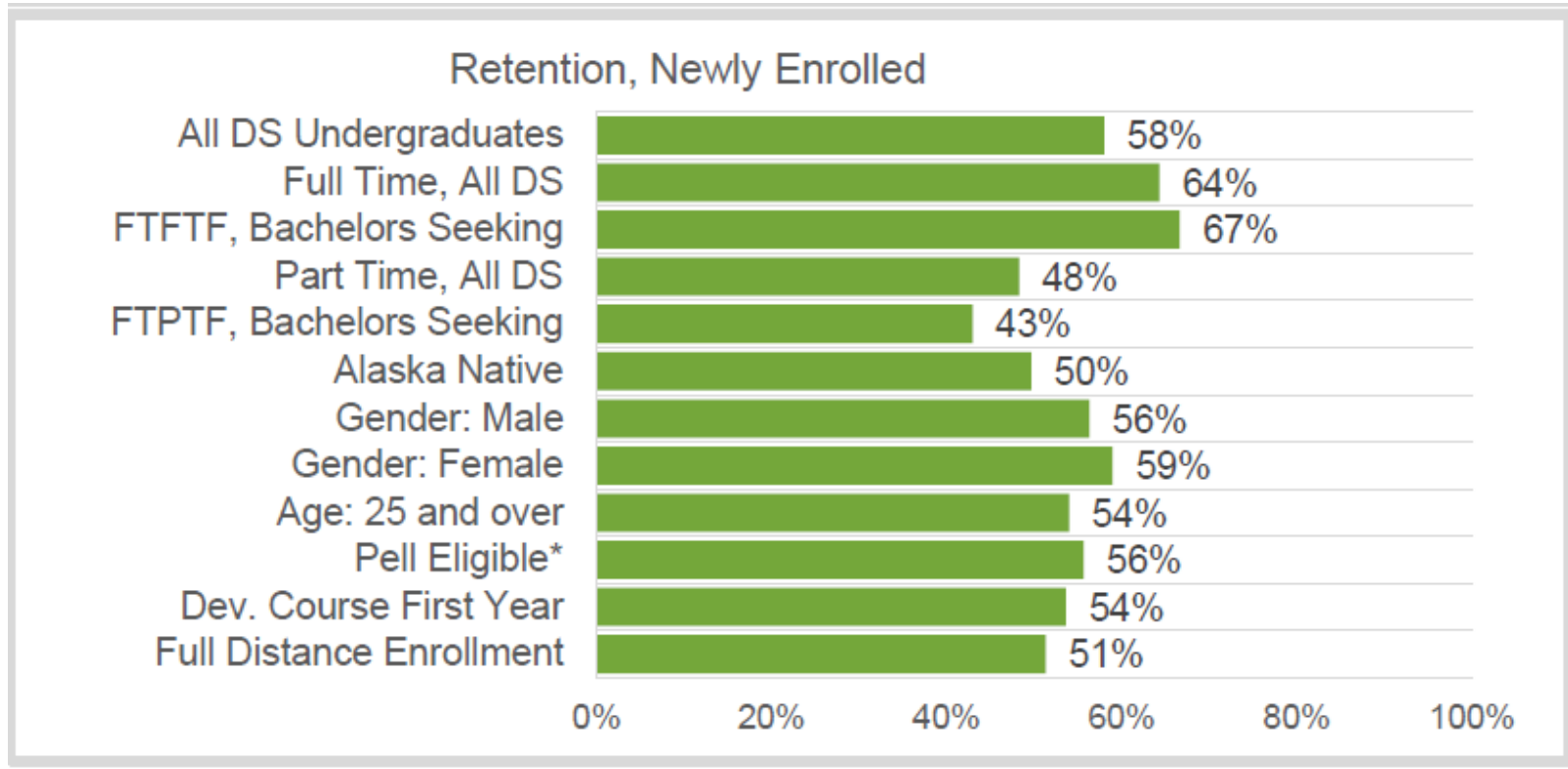
Primary Declared Degree
