Thesis Title: The Role of Apex Predators, Habitat, and Seascape Complexity on Nearshore Fish Assemblages in Southeast Alaska

Abstract: Nearshore marine ecosystems contain dynamic and complex habitats that offer shelter and prey for juvenile, migratory, and residential fish species. These fish communities are structured by habitat type, presence of apex predators, and seascape context. Understanding ecological dynamics is vital for evaluating how the nearshore supports robust fisheries.

Abstract: This research explores the patterns and mechanisms of paralytic shellfish toxicity in Southeast Alaska's commercially harvested geoduck clams. Alaska's commercial fishery for these giant clams is a small but lucrative fishery and the presence of these toxins can cause disruptive declines in fishery openings and harvest.

UAF Honorary Doctor of Fine Arts




Joining us today in celebration is master weaver and Indigenous knowledge bearer Della Sdaahlk'awaás Cheney. Cheney has received an honorary Doctor of Fine Arts degree from the University of Alaska Fairbanks.

Born and raised in Kake, Cheney learned the art of weaving and the importance of sharing traditional knowledge from her grandmother. She has practiced and taught weaving for decades, combining ancestral wisdom with contemporary concerns about environmental stewardship. She has documented her knowledge through photos and videos, and, in 2017 published her book, *Weaving Our World*. Cheney has received many awards, including the Alaska Federation of Natives' Culture Bearer Award, the Juneau Arts and Humanities Council's Mayor's Award and the President's Everyday Hero Award from the Central Council of the Tlingit and Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska. She was executive secretary in the Office of the Governor, tribal administrator for the Qutekcak Native Tribe, cultural educator at Floyd Dryden Middle School and external relations coordinator for Sheldon Jackson College. She completed the Community Fellows Program at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

John Greely and Marla Berg have served the community of Juneau in many ways for over 40 years. John and Marla strive to ensure Juneau is a great place to live for everyone, regardless of their socio-economic status. They have been instrumental in helping to secure funding of essential services by leading committees and organizations through a variety of crises affecting the Juneau population.


John and Marla were foundational members of Meals on Wheels in Juneau.

John's service to the community includes the Association of Alaska School Boards and Catholic Community Services.

Marla served on the board of the Glory Hall for more than seven years, during which time she was one of the key people in the creation of the Juneau Housing First Collaborative, serving vulnerable people by providing permanent supportive housing. She, working with state and local agencies, advocated tirelessly for this project to elected officials and other funders. She was an invaluable resource during the COVID pandemic, working to create a new emergency shelter facility. She was a founding member of the "100 Women Who Care" organization, now grown to over 3,000 members, contributing over \$30,000 to local nonprofits.

Born and raised in Colorado, Devyn Reece moved to Juneau in 2011. Devyn has spent the majority of the past 13 years working for the Juneau School District (JSD) and today he graduates with a Bachelor of Arts in Special Education.

He began his career at JSD as a special education paraeducator. Currently, Devyn is the lead teacher of the Developmental Education Classroom (DEC) at Mendenhall River Community School.

In addition to teaching and attending school full time over the last year, Devyn

was also a nominee for the 2024 Inclusive Practice Award through the Governor's Council on Disabilities and Special Education, served on the Transforming Special Education task force, and was appointed to the Deaf Education Board for the State of Alaska.

Devyn is joined today in celebration by his husband, family, and friends. At the end of May, 2024, Devyn will begin his pursuit of a Master's in Applied Behavioral Analysis with an emphasis on Autism and a Deaf Education Certificate.
